PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Introduction

Sacred Heart Catholic School is a school with great pride and culture. This year our school celebrates its 105th year.

Our school has a great history and legacy that the Presentation Sisters established many years ago. Sacred Heart is a testament to this and will continue to live the vision that our Presentation Sisters initiated in 1912. My role as principal is to continue this legacy and further enhance the wonderful supportive and caring school culture that exists and further develop the educational opportunities and achievements of our students.

In 2016 we have been able to maintain our student enrolments, maintain 4 teaching classes and relevant staffing, provide specialist support programs and provide our students with programs in Science, Art, Music, History/Geography and PE. Although enrolments are steady, as a community we need to be mindful of this and continue to put our best foot forward in being united in supporting Sacred Heart Catholic School.

SCHOOL AND PARISH RELATIONSHIPS

I value the school's cooperative relationship with Fr Ken and I take this opportunity to acknowledge the work of Fr Ken in our community. Fr is very generous in the opportunities he provides for us to gather to celebrate mass and there is depth, sincerity and insight in the way he breaks open the word and proclaims God to the school community.

Teaching and Learning

Our curriculum focus in 2016 was to improve our Numeracy outcomes and in the area of Grammar and Punctuation. A new school based scope and sequence profile was created and becomes part of our school curriculum documentation. In complimenting this focus, staff have continued to embrace a culture of continuous improvement in all learning areas.

Staff were also in-serviced in both reading and comprehension strategies to enhance our literacy dedicated sessions. We have also continued to provide for the specific learning needs of students requiring further support in various learning areas. We have continued to offer individual tuition to children using the Reading Tutor Program and in 2016 we implemented to full Minilit literacy program run by Tanya Forward as well as still providing extra support for children requiring differentiation in all classes.

After close analysis of all school data, conversations with staff, observations and discussions about effective instructional strategies, there are a number of key improvements and modifications to enhance the quality of our teaching and learning programs. These strategies will be in the key areas of literacy, numeracy and effective pedagogical practices as well as developing visible learning practices in each of our classroom.

The Sporting arena has had many highlight in 2016. The students participated enthusiastically in swimming, cross country, athletics and cricket interschool carnivals. We acknowledge the collective talent of our students in the sporting domain and look forward to their development in 2017.
